

Escambia County Voters Overwhelmingly Support Financial Assistance

For Immediate Release:

According to a recent Inweekly/Political Matrix study we asked 739 Escambia voters their opinion on how the \$57 million in CARES Act funding, for the county, should be spent. In overwhelming fashion, we found that support for the community and the community economic structure are great. The drive for financial support is so overwhelming, there is not much room for debate with each issue polled.

First, we see 74.7% support the county using part of the funding to provide up to \$4,000 of relief, per household, for those who have been affected medically or financially by COVID 19.

We then see that 78.5% wanted to follow Orange County’s lead of providing \$10,000 grants to small businesses who have has to shut down because of the COVID 19 pandemic.

Next, we see again overwhelming support of 70.2% support for the county using part of the monies for funding an increase in COVID 19 testing. Here there were only 18.5% saying no with the rest being undecided.

Interesting though, when it came to the county using funds to improve Wi-Fi capabilities, we only see 59.8% support for this with 27.7% saying no and the rest being undecided. This is the one funding issue that has the second lowest support in the study, however, it is still nearly 60% in support of the measure.

Surprisingly, when it came to the funding infrared temperature scanners for government buildings, only 35.5% supported using the funding for this measure. And, instead of the undecideds being high, we see that 41.7% said No. This is very interesting as this is a vital part of government workers and persons who visit governmental buildings can be safe.

However, different from the temperature scanners, when it came to standard PPE gear, 73.6% supported using the resources in the Act to fund face masks, sanitizers, and other PPE gear to small businesses and residents.

METHODOLOGY:

The cross tabs for this study are party, age and gender. The persons sampled were Escambia County likely voters with a voting score of 85% for the general election cycles. The voters called were those only with landlines and were called using an Interactive Voice Response (IVR) system and were called during the hours of 6PM to 8PM on July 10, 2020. The Margin of Error for this study is +/- 4.5% with a confidence level of 95%. Please see details on the following pages.
